



2008 Arizona National 4-H Conference Delegate Position Description



Role of 2008 Arizona 4-H National 4-H Conference Delegate:

- To assist in the development of recommendations to help guide the 4-H Youth Development Programs nationally and in their communities
- To be engaged in pre and post conference activities
- To be focused on representing *Youth Voices* and implementing *Youth Action* back home

Arizona National 4-H Conference Delegate:

- Youth Delegates must be 15 years of age as of January 1, 2008

Responsibilities:

- Be willing to work as a team member and assist in carrying out the identified plan of action

Qualifications:

Experience and involvement in local, county, area and/or state developmental communities, advisory groups, councils, etc

- Commitment to work prior to Conference in collecting facts, ideas, etc. of local people regarding concerns of youth
- Commitment to work following the Conference to apply new skills back home
- Flexibility to meet changing situations and have growth potential and a curiosity about situations, people and events
- Evident capacity to cope with ambiguity
- Concern about issues and involved in deciding to solve the problems and move forward with solutions
- Strong personal skills

Individual's Commitment:

The Arizona 4-H Conference Delegate Team will meet a minimum of 2 times a year on a face-to-face basis with additional meetings taking place via conference calls on an as needed basis (at least bi-monthly or monthly for an hour). Face-to-face meetings would be held centrally.

The Delegate Team will be asked to present at least two leadership workshops at statewide 4-H events during the 2008 year. Expenses to be covered for Delegate Team members include travel, meals, conference calls, and registration fees budgeted.

The Benefits of Serving on a Committee:

- To have input in the National 4-H Conference's recommendations to the Secretary of Agriculture
- To shape the national and state 4-H Youth Development Program
- To grow in leadership skills and share your experiences with others
