Partners for Life: A Service Dog’s Tale is a 7-½ minute video that provides information about the rights of individuals with disabilities and their service dog partners in public places. The video, featuring Debi and Peek, Susan and Molly, and other partners, describes different types of disabilities and characteristics of service dogs. Educational materials in the packet include a fact sheet with frequently asked questions, a pre/post test and a copy of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Although the ADA was passed in 1990, often the general public does not understand the full extent of the law. This training video addresses that issue. Featuring actual residents of Tucson with their service dogs, the video discusses how these partners have the same access rights as any other citizen. The video is designed for business owners and members of the general public to offer more information about this access. The University of Arizona College of Agriculture Diversity Committee partnered with several organizations to develop and sponsor this video training package.
