

WHAT:	2010 Arbor Day Tree Planting and Community Celebration
WHEN:	Saturday, April 24, 2010, 10 AM
WHERE:	White Cliffs Middle School (Airway Avenue and Prospector Street)
WHO:	The City of Kingman, the University of Arizona Mohave County School Gardening Program, the Cerbat Garden Club, the Kingman Unified School District, and the Mohave County Master Gardeners

Please join us on Saturday, April 24, 2010, for another successful tree planting day at the new Kingman White Cliffs Middle School. The Arbor Day Poster Contest winners will also be recognized and awarded prior to the tree planting celebration. All local business and individuals may participate in the Arbor Day celebration by donating to the school Arbor Day education and/or community tree planting projects to beautify Kingman landscapes.

Since the 2002 Arbor Day Celebration, we have planted 166 trees in honor of Arbor Day to beautify Kingman's streets, parks, schools, and homes

- 2002 First community Arbor Day celebration with 50 trees planted by volunteers and students at the Kingman High School, Kingman Middle School, Centennial Park, Cecil Davis Park, and County Fairgrounds marking 50 years of city incorporation on National Arbor Day, April 25.
- 2007 Total of 70 trees planted at 7 locations celebrating the Arbor Week in Kingman: KUSD Hualapai, KUSD La Senita, KUSD Mt. Tipton, KUSD Pass/Pals, KAOL Intermediate, KAOL Middle, and Cecil Davis Park.
- 2008 30 trees planted at Monsoon Park (Eastern & Southern Avenues), with over 105 volunteers (including Councilmen Ray Lyons and Councilwomen Janet Watson).
- 2009 Airway underpass, 16 trees and 82 shrubs, over 75 people including Kingman Mayor John Salem and Councilmen Ray Lyons show up to help with tree planting and finished in less than one hour.
