School Gardening Workshop

The training will focus on establishing school gardening program in Mohave County Schools. There will be hands-on training on the basics of botany, horticulture, soil science, water conservation, and agricultural food science. The workshop participants will receive agricultural science curriculum from the National Ag-in-the Classroom, Arizona Agricultural Literacy, National Arbor Day Foundation, Food Land People, Junior Master Gardeners, Water Education Project, and National Gardening Association. They will also learn about Volunteer recruitment, media contact, and fundraising strategies which will help enhance and sustain continue effort for their school gardening program.

Mohave County educators completing the training program will also receive continue education credits as approved by the Mohave County School Superintendent's Office.
