4-H Record Books- Don't Wait Until the Last Minute!

A key component of the 4-H educational experience is learning how to keep and maintain records of your 4-H project(s) and activities. It is also one of the requirements for successfully completing the current 4-H year. Not to mention it is a skill that you will use through out your life.

At minimum you must turn in your completed record book to your community club leader before the end of the 4-H year, which is September 30th. Check with your leader for their deadline for submission. In addition, everyone is strongly encouraged to submit their records for judging at the county level, which will occur in October.

Your 4-H Record Book should tell the story, and accurately, of what you have done, with emphasis on growth and development in the main project area, leadership, citizenship and service to others.

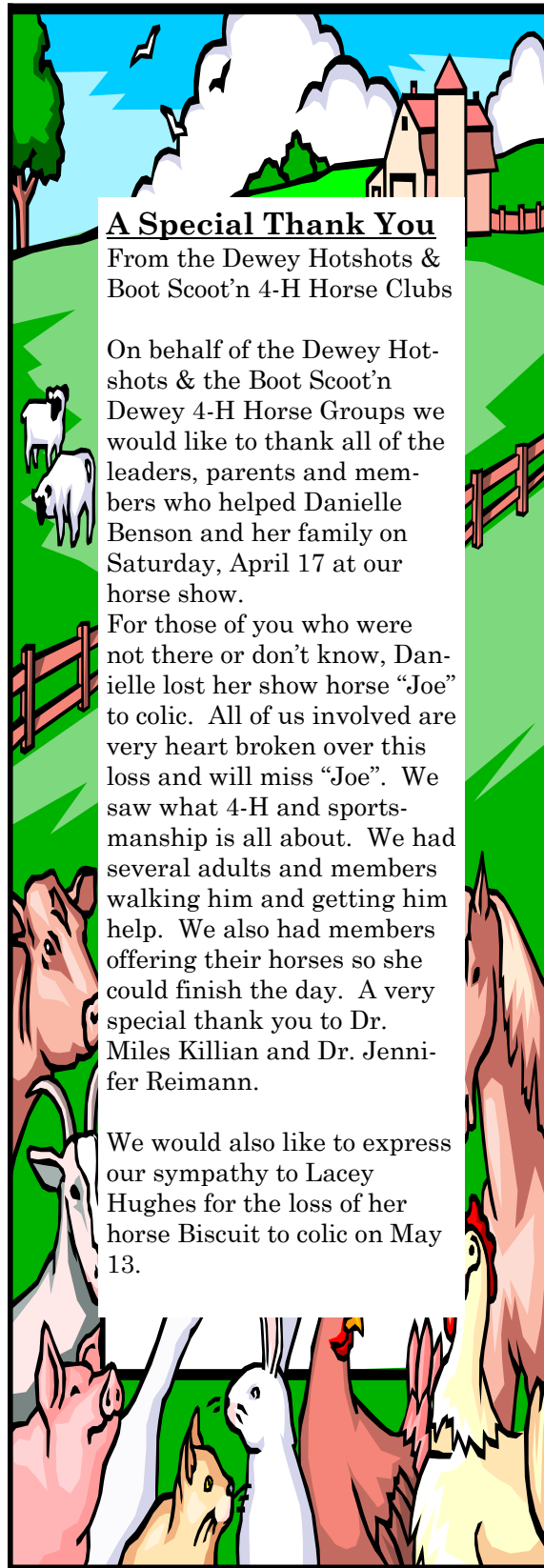

A young boy was walking with his father along a country road. When they came across a very large tree branch the boy asked, "Do you think I could move that branch.?" Discouraged he said, "Dad, you are wrong I can't do it." His dad said, "Try again." This time, as the boy struggled with the branch his father joined him and together they pushed the branch aside.
